

Classifiers and Shapes

Classifiers are groups of different handshapes used to show people or objects. Or hold objects of different size or shape. This would include objects which are round, square, oblong, flat, etc.

Shapes - round, square, triangle, oblong, flat, box.

In the class - wall, door, window, floor, table, book, pin, drawer, cupboard, chair, paper, pen.

Classifiers

- a person - to meet, to follow, a meeting
people - a queue, a very long queue, a crowd, very crowded, audience, group,
legs - walking, jumping, going upstairs, going downstairs, escalator,
eyes - watch, look up, look down, look around, look at each other, stare, gaze, cat look at the dog, etc.
vehicle - car, overtake, line of traffic, traffic jam, slow moving traffic
lights - strip lights, disco light, traffic lights, headlights, indicator, lamps, street lamps, power cut, etc.
